



The lakes, the trespassers, and the rubbish. The photograph shows a typical example of bridge building using all manner of items scavenged or stolen from the vicinity of the Dawes Lane allotments. A member of the public removed all this rubbish and challenged one of the perpetrators. For his pains he was threatened with violence. The police were informed but they showed little interest. More rubbish now clogs the stream at the same point.

In Dawes Lane itself, two stalwart Cherry Hinton lady members, with a combined age of 160, carried out a thorough litter pick during March. They notice that the recently-installed litter bins are not being greatly used.
